

The Biblical Flood Global Warming and Bush's Harvest By William W. Morgan

Today's news is not so good. Global warming is on the rise, the war on terrorism seems to have no ending, and politicians are once again involved in scandals. What can we do? Plenty, says author William W. Morgan in his groundbreaking new book, *The Biblical Flood: Global Warming and Bush's Harvest*. In clear, thoughtful prose, Morgan argues that we must use our individual freedoms to change the world for the good of our species. Unless we do so, he suggests, our downward spiral will continue.

Morgan focuses on global warming, which he emphatically states is caused by man, and attacks the damage that has been orchestrated by the Bush administration. Global Dumbing, as he calls it, is simply our failure to think and to solve our many problems. Our greatest problem, he feels, is leaving the solutions to the politicians who have done nothing for our planet, our schools, or the world at large. Why, he asks, do we have a social system that does not allow us to solve any of our great problems? Why is our society based on coercion rather than individual actions for the good of the people?

Every chapter begins with an incisive summary and background. Peppered with helpful website links, this terrific book even includes a glossary of terms. Fierce, angry, and provocative, Morgan argues for us to gently disengage from political systems, from organized religions, and from the military complex. We must, suggests Morgan, use our individual power to unsettle the status quo if we ever hope to find the bolder, brighter future we all deserve. Brilliantly stated, this is a book that just could change the world.
